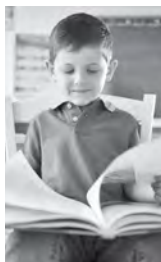

Materials fee \$100 for new students and \$30 for returning students at class covers first few projects. 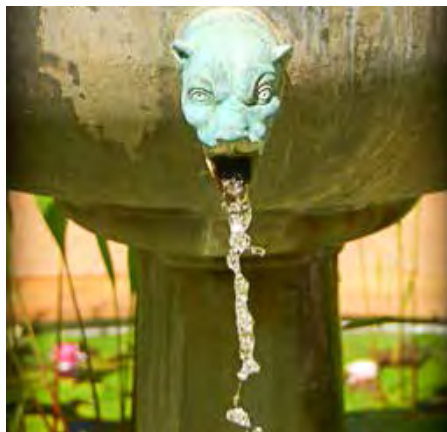

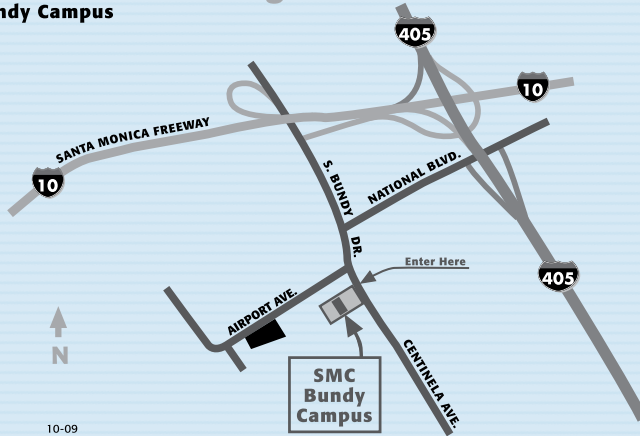
CLASS LOCATIONS/PARKING:
