Bond and charcoal paper (sizes 9x12 and 18x24) Typing paper (50-100 sheets) Krylon crystal clear fixative or Blair odorless fixative Vinyl eraser Cardboard sheets, corrugated (sizes 9x12, 12x15, 18x24, 24x30x3 of each) Masonite board (24x30) Masking tape Push pins (box of 100) Ruler (12" or 18") Single edge razor blades (2) Scissors Utility knife or cutting cardboard (optional) Easterbrook ballbearing clips #40 or Boston clips #40 or Boston clips #4 (2) Plastic sheets (9x11) Manilla folders (3) and small envelope to hold grids, masks and small papers Red portfolio (24x36). Re-enforce handles, side and corners with duct tape

Notes on Getting Cardboard

Aaron Brothers (see above) sells and cuts cardboard to size

Plastic Mart, 2101 Pico Blvd., SM (call to inquire when cardboard will be discarded) Try appliances stores (refrigerator boxes, etc.) furniture stores, supermarkets, etc. Try to find lightweight cardboard since, it is easy to carry and to cut. Look for cardboard with a smooth surface because you will be drawing on it. To cut cardboard use single edge razor blade, matte knife, or utility knife. Cut away from your body,
