Glass Fusing: Big Ideas for Small Projects

Discover how to use fused glass to create jewelry, holiday ornaments, suncatchers, and other small items. Learn about glass choices, preparation, cutting, and composition, and find out how to do basic wire wrapping, gluing, and jewelry assembly. Experiment with the materials, then apply your own distinctive style to the pieces you create. Materials fee \$50 at class covers basic tools and various types of glass and other materials. Advanced students with tools pay \$15 materials fee at class. As this class is in high demand with limited seating, all registrations are final, and NO REFUNDS, CREDITS, or TRANSFERS will be given.

Stone Carving

Learn stone carving techniques using traditional hand tools: sculpture hammer, chisel, rasp, and file. Finish your work by sanding, polishing, and mounting on a wood base. Create three dimensional abstract or representational sculptures. Bring sketches of your ideas to the first meeting. Beginning students will purchase alabaster or soap stone at the first meeting. Stones will range approximately \$20-\$40, plus \$20 for finishing supplies. Basic tools provided for use in class. Advanced students may continue on existing projects. Materials fee \$60 at class.

Have a guitar sitting somewhere, just waiting to be played? Ever wanted to strum the strings and make music, but think it's too hard for you? Learn how to read music, play the open chords that are widely used in guitar music, and gain an overview of basic music theory. 

PARKING:

Complimentary parking is only for class attendance purposes and where the parking facility is operated by Santa Monica College.

Parking is included with your Community Education registration for classes at the main SMC Campus, Bundy Campus, Performing Arts Center, and Malibu Campus. but REQUIRES a VIRTUAL PARKING PERMIT. Within two (2) business days of registering for an SMC Community Education course, you will receive an email from the SMC Parking/ Cashier's Office with step-by-step instructions on how to register your vehicle for the virtual parking permit. You will need to use the phone number and email address you used for Community Education registration. You must complete this process each term in order to avoid a parking citation. Any parking citations your vehicle receives will be solely your responsibility. If you are registering for a course that begins the next day, our staff will attempt to get the parking instructions sent within one (1) business day. If you have

questions, email *commed@smc.edu*. Parking is enforced 24/7. Permit is for Student Parking only—DO NOT PARK IN STAFF PARKING—YOU WILL BE TICKETED.

For classes at the **SMC Emeritus Campus**, parking is available in the City parking structure #2, located at the corner of Second St. and Wilshire Blvd. Parking is free for the first 90 minutes, \$1 for the next hour, and \$1.50 for each additional 30 minutes, up to a maximum of \$14. Evening rates after 6 p.m. may vary. Head-in parking ONLY.

Disclaimer: While we strive to maintain accurate and up-to-date information on parking at the College, please understand that the parking policies for Santa Monica College can change without notice. All parking regulations are created and enforced by the Santa Monica College Campus Police and anyone parking on SMC property is advised to read and adhere to all posted signs. CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICIES

NO CANCELLATION AFTER A CLASS HAS STARTED, so choose courses carefully! Requests for withdrawal from a class must be submitted in writing via email at least seven (7) business days before the start date of the class; requests made via other methods, such as phone messages, will NOT be accepted. You may receive a credit voucher for future Community Education classes, which is valid for two (2) years from the date of issue. A minimum service charge of \$10 per class cancellation will be withheld. Refunds are granted ONLY if a class is cancelled, discontinued, or rescheduled. For cancelled classes, the course fee is automatically refunded. Credit card refunds are processed within seven (7) business days.

Transfers

To transfer to another class, requests must be submitted in writing via email at least *seven* (7) business days before the original class meets. A minimum service charge of \$10 per class transfer will be deducted.

Important Information: Refunds are NOT issued for absences nor prorated for late registrations. Missed class meetings may not be made up in another class. There is no auditing of classes. You are strongly encouraged to register as far in advance as possible before a class begins.

Some high-demand classes, such as glass fusing and Good Times Travel day trips, have separate and different refund policies stating that all registrations are final, and no refunds, credits, or transfers will be given. Please keep that in mind when registering for those classes.
